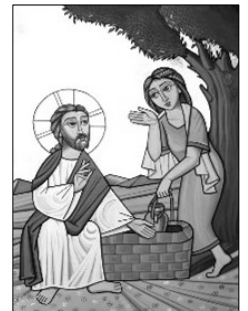

A small but always persistent discipline is a great force; for a soft drop falling persistently, hollows out hard rock.

St. Isaac the Syrian



The fruits of trees are hard, repugnant to the taste, and unfit for consumption until the sweetness that comes from the sun has fallen upon them.

Even so, the first labors of repentance are bitter and extremely repugnant and they give the solitary, no consolation until they receive the sweetness that comes from divine vision which translates the heart from earthly things such that it even forgets itself.
