PASTORAL TEACHINGS, DIRECTIVES, **NOTES & SAYINGS**

REGARDING THE READING OF THE PSALMS:

In the cultural context of our times, there is a strong need to continue in our private lives the liturgical rhythm of the Church. When our life stops being a continuation of the Divine Holy Liturgy, we cease being Orthodox Christians.

The Psalter ... the icons of our prayer corner, are never absent from the home of every Christian.

In the services of the Orthodox Church the Psalms form the backbone of all the services.

In the monasteries during the course of one week the Psalter is read entirely one time, and during Great Lent it is read twice during one week.

St. Basil the Great believes that “There is no liturgical book that better serves God than the Psalter.”
